Two workshops will take place simultaneously: one for people of color-identified students and one for white-identified students. We recognize POC-identified and white-identified people have different needs and work to do to break down the effects of racism. We want to create supportive spaces where people can have honest conversations and address their particular race-related issues and concerns. Sessions will begin and end together, and emphasis will be placed on follow-up opportunities for cross-racial- and further same-race-based conversations.

These workshops will provide a critical starting point for reflecting on and exploring of how white supremacy affects education across CUNY's campuses, and how, as teaching fellows and adjuncts, we can combat racism's effects. The work of these workshops will be further supported by events through the Teaching and Learning Center and the Social Justice Pedagogy Committee.
